

# inute Books Restored


The minute books of the PMI have undergone much needed restoration, thanks to a generous City of Stonnington Community Grant for \$1760.

Peter Lewis of Rutherford Fine Leather Binding carried out the professional restoration work, which consisted of rebinding in matching leather and suede coverings, and tissue repair on some damaged pages of the oldest minute book (which had long ago lost its front cover). Thanks to Rutherford for doing a wonderful job on these

important treasures, which record the history of the PMI from 1861 to 1966. They have been preserved for posterity and will be proudly displayed in our rare books cabinet at the library.

# ➣ PMI Library Collection Guide ~ No 6. Mechanics' Institute Resources Collection

# Introduction

This part of the PMI Library collection is in its infancy, but promises to one day be the most comprehensive collection of items relating to the history of mechanics' institutes. The MIRC is a partnership project of the PMI and the Mechanics' Institutes of Victoria (MIV). The MIRC computer and vertical file are located at the middle window on the west side of the library.

## Aims of the MIRC

The MIRC will be the authorised repository centre for research of mechanics' institutes in the State of Victoria (and beyond) past and present and will be a point of contact and information for those concerned with the preservation and management of existing institutes and buildings, including committees of management, heritage and tourism organisations and municipal councils.

## In the Collection

<u>The 'Big Mech' Database</u> (now set up on the MIRC computer) contains records for almost every mechanics' institute in Victoria, and the information contained in the records will soon be able to be printed off in a report format.

The <u>Vertical File</u> contains articles, booklets, ephemera, images, reports and other materials about individual mechanics' institutes. Currently the file holds information about 247 individual institutes in Victoria and beyond.

'<u>Pete's Pedia'</u> is a growing series of CDs containing images of material professionally scanned by Peter Pereyra of the MIV Committee. The material includes minute books, building plans, ephemera and many other important documents concerned with mechanics' institutes. The MIV hopes to organise many loans of such material, currently owned by historical societies, municipal councils, private owners, etc, so that it can be scanned for future researchers and help to preserve the originals.

<u>Books</u> - the PMI library already has many Victorian MI histories in the library collection. Thanks to the generosity of MIV Committee member Wallace Kirsop there are funds available for us to purchase some interstate MI histories for the library also. These histories are marked with a bookplate showing they are a part of the MIRC.

Soon we hope to have a small display case in the MIRC area of the library to show some items of mechanics' institute memorabilia which has been collected by Pam Baragwanath. There will be reports in this newsletter throughout 2008 to keep you up to date with the MIRC.

After the Picture Show Secretary Cathy Milward-Bason presented Peter with a certificate of appreciation (below right) for all his work making the picture show such a successful annual event.






## PMI PRESS UPDATE


